- 2) Our principal was a chairman of the Viva voce of Ph. D in Geography in Solapur University, Solapur.
- 3) He was also a member of two DRCs of Ph D in Geography in the same university.
- 4) The faculty and the students are encouraged to present and publish research papers in various conferences and journals. Due to it, our faculty members have presented research papers in various conferences as well as published research papers in various reputed journals.
- 5) Faculty are encouraged to pursue M. Phil./Ph. D. During the academic Year 2017-18, two faculty members were awarded Ph. D. Degree. Besides, 8 teachers are pursuing Ph. D. in their respective subjects at present.
- 6) Due to the encouragement to the teachers and students by the IQAC, the articles of the three of our students published in the college magazine *Deenbandhu* received awards by Solapur University, Solapur.
- 7) Due to the encouragement by the IQAC, 1 international, 26 national, 1 state and 2 university level conferences were attended by our faculty wherein 26 research papers were presented by them. In addition, 19 research papers by our teachers were published in the national level conference proceedings. One research paper each was published in an e-journal and an international level conference proceeding during the year.

3.26 Major Activities during the year in the sphere of extension activities and Institutional Social Responsibility

xi. The birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel was celebrated as National Integration Day.

xii. Our teachers gave lectures on socially relevant topics like 'Environment and Water Management', 'Farmers' Suicide', 'Practical Geography', 'Economic Policy of Chh. Shahu Maharaj', 'Changing Banking', etc. at various educational institutions.

xiii. Articles on the socially relevant topics by our faculty were published in Daily Divya Marathi, a Marathi daily newspaper during the year. Other faculty member tried to create awareness about pressing social issues through his short story titled 'Durgi' published in the Deepawali edition of Daily Sangola Nagari.

xiv. Two of our faculty members are the members of Solapur Branch of Family Planning Association of India.

xv. One of our teachers has been elected as a Member of Solapur Municipal Corporation and is serving the society.

xvi. One of the faculty members was a chief guest for Hindi Day at Sholapur Social Association's Arts & Commerce College, Solapur wherein he explained the importance of Hindi language in the national integration.

xvii. Our teachers helped other educational institutions offering higher and secondary education by working as subject experts for the appointment of teachers in them.

xviii. Our Director of Physical Education was appointed as Subject Expert for the appointment of Director of Physical Education in V V P Institute of Engineering and Technology, Solapur and Lokmangal College of Biotechnology, Wadala, Dist: Solapur. He also worked as a subject expert in physical education for the placement of a faculty of UAE Women's College, Solapur under CAS. He participated in Olympic Task Force Conference at Balewadi, Pune on 19/04/2017 on behalf of Department of Sports, Government of India. He was also, being the Sports Coordinator of Solapur University, the Secretary of West Zone Interuniversity Table Tennis Tournament held at C B Khedgi's College, Akkalkot.

Best Practice 1

1. Title of the Practice:

Encouragement and freedom by the management

2. Goal

The aim of the practice is to impart quality education in the college. The management encourages teachers, administrative staff and students to come up with creative, novel ideas that could enhance the quality of the education imparted by the college. The relevant ideas are accepted. They are given liberty to implement them. The purpose of our institution is not to just create degree holder, but to groom ideal citizens. All this contributes to the sustaining and enhancing of the quality of education imparted by the college.

3. The Context

Most of our students are multilingual, rural, economically backward and socially marginalized. Moreover, they come from educationally backward families. This poses a great challenge. Most of our students are first generation learners. Parents are ignorant of the challenges that their wards are going to face in future. It makes encouragement and freedom by the management imperative. It enables the students to face challenges.

4. The Practice

Teachers are motivated by the management to use ICT in teaching-learning activity. For this purpose, they have been provided with a laptop, LCD projector etc. We have subscribed for INFLIBNET that provides teachers and students access to e-books and e-journals. Moreover, we have 80 educational DVDs/CDs. Movies based on the syllabi are screened which helps the students' comprehension. Some teachers also use mobile phone for teaching-learning purpose. A university level workshop on "Revised Syllabus of B A I Opt. English and B A II Opt. Hindi" was organised in association with Solapur University, Solapur on 18/01/2018.

The management encourages students to participate in various college, university, state and national level activities and competitions. We have 'Poor Students' Aid

Fund' through which twenty three poor and needy students have been financially assisted during the academic year. Students are given representation on various important college committees, which provides them an opportunity to share their innovative ideas. It makes the education imparted by the college student centric. One hundred forty one students have benefited from the book bank facility during the academic year.

5. Evidence of Success

Due to the encouragement and freedom by our management, we could start research place for Ph. D. in the subjects of Economics and Geography. During the year 10 of our students participated in sports at university level. During the academic year, the number of teachers who successfully completed an Orientation Programme, Refresher Course, Winter/Summer Schools, and Short Term Course conducted by HRDCs is 1, 1, 3 and 6 respectively. Besides 3 of our faculty members successfully completed Faculty Development Programmes conducted by other institutions during the academic year. First three prizes were bagged by our students in the taluka level elocution competition organised by Solapur Branch of Nehru Yuva Kendra. In the district level elocution competition organised by the same institute, first and third prizes were got by our students; the student who won first prize in this competition got the opportunity to participate in the state level elocution competition organised at Mumbai. Two students participated in 'Bhauasaheb Gandhi Marathi Elocution Competition' organised by Walchand College, Solapur. Three students participated in the elocution competition held at Mohol in Solapur by Youth Parliament. In addition, fourteen students participated in various activities like Mehndi, Rangoli and Fashion Show in SAN Utsav, a cultural competition organised by Sangameshwar College, Solapur. Sixty students participated in the Exam on Indian Culture organised by Vivekananda Kendra, Solapur. During the academic year, the college hosted Intercollegiate Kho-Kho Tournament which inspired many students of the college to participate in sports. During the year our students participated in Kho-Kho, Kabaddi, Taekwondo, Wrestling, and Boxing Competitions at various levels. Three of our students were selected in the university Kho-Kho team to participate in West Zone Interuniversity Kho-Kho Tournament held at Nanded. Three boys and one girl from our college bagged place in Solapur University Kho-Kho Men and Women Team respectively that participated in the Maharashtra State Interuniversity Kho-Kho

Tournament organised at Dapoli. One male and one female student from the college were selected in Solapur University Kabaddi Team. Other Kabaddi player from the college was selected in the university team to participate in West Zone Interuniversity Kabaddi Tournament held at Pandit Deendayal Upadhaya Shekahavati University, Sikar, Rajasthan between 19/11/2017 and 22/11/2017. The first prize in Solapur University Intercollegiate Taekwondo Tournament (Weight Category: 68-74 kg) was got by our student. The second position in the weight categories of 48 kg, 54 kg, and 74-80 kg in the intercollegiate Taekwondo Tournament were bagged by our sports students. Nine of our students participated in the one day workshop 'National Youth Programme' organised at Dayanand College, Solapur. One student participated in the state level NSS Camp organised between 10/02/2018 to 16/02/2018 at Rashtrasant Tukhadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur; our NSS Coordinator participated in the same camp as a team manager. One of our NSS Volunteers participated in 'Avhan Camp: 2017', a state level disaster management programme organised at Shivaji University, Kolhapur. Two other NSS volunteers participated in 'Avhan Camp: 2018' organised at Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad between 25/04/2018 to 03/03/2018. The first prize in the elocution competition held in 'Utkarsh Social and Cultural Competitions' (23/02/2018 to 26/02/2018) at Swami Ramananda Tirth University, Nanded, was bagged by our student. Thirty five students from the college participated in sixteen events in the Youth Festival of Solapur University during the academic year wherein second prize in Installation and third prize in Clay Modelling were got by our students.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

We have not encountered any problem so far despite having scanty resources. However, the parents of female students are reluctant to allow their ward to participate in sports and cultural activities for they have to travel for this.

Best Practice 2

1. Title of the Practice:

Motivation for the Research

2. Goal

The aim of this practice is to sustain and enhance the research culture on the campus, which ultimately will prove very instrumental in enhancing the quality of education imparted by the institution. We do believe that research is as important as teaching.

3. The Context

Our college is situated in rural area. Most of our students come from economically, educationally backward and socially marginalized rural families. We are trying our best to give them quality education so that they could compete with any students anywhere. We are well aware of what a great role research can play in this endeavour of ours.

4. The Practice

The management encourages the staff and the students alike to undertake research. Teachers are given D. L. to attend and present research papers in various conferences.

5. Evidence of Success

The college has been approved to be the research place for Ph. D. in the subjects of Economics and Geography by the university. Two students from our research place were awarded Ph D during 2017-18. At present nine students are pursuing Ph. D. in the research place. During the academic Year 2017-18, two of our faculty members obtained Ph. D. degree. Six others are pursuing this degree. During the academic year one of our faculty members presented a research paper in an international conference, 25 research papers were presented by 14 of our teachers at national level conferences, while 29 national conferences were attended by fifteen teachers. One teacher attended a state level conference during the year. During the year 1 teacher was a resource person in one national level conference and three university level workshops and six teachers worked as subject experts in their respective subjects at various educational institutions. Three of them were VC Nominated subject experts. Two of the faculty

members chaired technical sessions at conferences, while three were resource persons in conferences organised by other colleges. Apart from it, 19 research papers of 12 teachers were published in national level conference proceedings. One research paper each was published in e-journal and international level conference proceedings. One of the faculty members was a chairperson for four Ph. D. viva voce. One of our faculty members has published 5 books with ISBN and a chapter written by other teacher was published in an edited book. Three articles by our students published in the college magazine 'Deenbandhu' got prizes by the university.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Due to semester pattern, teachers and students get less time to devote to research. Co-curricular and extra-curricular activities also demand their time. These are some of the challenges.
