- Best Library User Award is given to the students.
- Teachers use participatory teaching methods.
- Continuous internal assessment of the students is done by the faculty through unit tests, home assignments, class tests (written & oral) etc.

We constantly encourage faculty and students to undertake research. The teachers are given D. L. and T. A. or Registration Fee whichever is more to participate and present research papers in conferences.

Library has been provided a computer for better functioning. We have subscribed for INFLIBNET which provides teachers and students access to e-books and e-journals. Our teachers constantly encourage the students to make maximum use of print as well as e-resources. Teachers and students have access to computer in the computer lab. Students are given computer training. Instrumentations of the Department of Geography are used for even social purpose. This department has conducted village survey of Hattur, Tal: South Solapur.

Forty committees are constituted for the better academic and administrative functioning of the institution. Teachers, students, administrative staff and other stakeholders have representation on these committees. The Alumni Association and Parent-Teacher Association also play important role in the activities of the institution.

Best Practice

1. Title of the Practice:

Encouragement and freedom by the management

2. Goal

The aim of the practice is to impart quality education in the college. The management encourages teachers, administrative staff and students to come up with creative, novel ideas that could enhance the quality of the education imparted by the college. The relevant ideas are accepted. They are given liberty to implement them. The purpose of our institution is not to just create degree holder, but to groom ideal citizens. All this contributes to the sustaining and enhancing of the quality of education imparted by the college.

3. The Context

Most of our students are multilingual, rural, economically backward and socially marginalized. Moreover, they come from educationally backward families. This poses a great challenge. Most of our students are first generation learners. Parents are ignorant of the challenges that their pupils are going to face in future. It makes encouragement and freedom by the management imperative. It enables the students to face challenges.

4. The Practice

Teachers are motivated by the management to use ICT in teaching-learning activity. For this purpose, they have been provided with a laptop, LCD projector etc. We have subscribed for INFLIBNET that provides teachers and students access to e-books and e-journals. Moreover, we have 63 educational DVDs/CDs. Movies based on the syllabi are screened which helps the students' comprehension. Audio CD based on the syllabus has been played on the recorder. Teachers maintain academic diary. It helps them to do preparation for lectures, planning of various co-curricular, extra-

curricular activities. It plays crucial role in their self-evaluation.

Administrative staff is also encouraged to participate in orientation and other career development programmes which has enabled them to incorporate new techniques in administration. These programmes have also helped to better interpersonal relationships.

The management encourages students to participate in various college level, university level, state and national level activities and competitions, which in turn encourages the remaining students. We have 'Poor Students' Aid Fund' through which fifteen poor and needy students have been financially assisted during the academic year. Students are given representation on various important college committees, which provides them an opportunity to share their innovative ideas. It makes the education imparted in the college student centric.

5. Evidence of Success

Due to the encouragement and freedom by our management, we could start research centres for Ph. D. in the subjects of Economics and Geography. Our Men Kho-Kho Team won the Inter-collegiate Kho-Kho Tournament of Solapur University for the eighth successive year, which is a record. This year 3 and 2 teachers successfully completed refresher and summer school courses respectively. 2 teachers have completed national level one day human rights training programme. The institution organizes a series of lectures for two days every year wherein eminent personalities from different walks of life are invited to give lectures on various topics. Not only our staff and students, but the people from Mandrup and neighbouring villages benefit from these lectures.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

We have not encountered any problem so far. However, we have scanty resources. Moreover, the people in the region expect government to do everything. The women students are not allowed by their parents to participate in sports and some cultural activities as they have to travel for this.
