- Continuous internal assessment of the students is done by the faculty through unit tests, home assignments, class tests (written & oral), question-answer sessions, student seminars, group discussions, etc.
- Expert lectures on various subjects are organised throughout the year.
- Deenbandhu Award is given to the student who stands first in B. A. Course.
- Late Gangappa Gadag Memorial Award is given to the student who stands first in B. Com. Course.

Best Practice

1. Title of the Practice:

Encouragement and freedom by the management

2. Goal

The aim of the practice is to impart quality education in the college. The management encourages teachers, administrative staff and students to come up with creative, novel ideas that could enhance the quality of the education imparted by the college. The relevant ideas are accepted. They are given liberty to implement them. The purpose of our institution is not to just create degree holder, but to groom ideal citizens. All this contributes to the sustaining and enhancing of the quality of education imparted by the college.

3. The Context

Most of our students are multilingual, rural, economically backward and socially marginalized. Moreover, they come from educationally backward families. This poses a great challenge. Most of our students are first generation learners. Parents are ignorant of the challenges that their pupils are going to face in future. It makes encouragement and freedom by the management imperative. It enables the students to face challenges.

4. The Practice

Teachers are motivated by the management to use ICT in teaching-learning activity. For this purpose, they have been provided with a laptop, LCD projector etc. We have subscribed for INFLIBNET that provides teachers and students access to e-books and e-journals. Moreover, we have 79 educational DVDs/CDs. Movies based on the syllabi are screened which helps the students' comprehension. During the academic year 2016-17, a *rangoli* competition on diagrams in Economics was held. A national seminar on "Indian Agricultural and Socio-Economic Development after Globalization" was organised on 18/02/2017.

Administrative staff is also encouraged to participate in orientation and other career development programmes which has enabled them to incorporate new techniques in administration. These programmes have also helped to better interpersonal relationships.

The management encourages students to participate in various college level, university level, state and national level activities and competitions, which in turn encourages the remaining students. We have 'Poor Students' Aid Fund' through which fourteen poor and needy students have been financially assisted during the academic year. Students are given representation on various important college committees, which provides them an opportunity to share their innovative ideas. It makes the education imparted in the college student centric. One hundred and seven students have benefited from the book facility during the academic year.

5. Evidence of Success

Due to the encouragement and freedom by our management, we could start research centres for Ph. D. in the subjects of Economics and Geography. This year 10 of our students participated in sports at university level. During the academic year, 1 teacher successfully completed an orientation course and 5 teachers successfully completed refresher courses. Like every year the institution organized a series of lectures during this year too on 24/12/2016 wherein eminent personalities from different walks of life were invited to give lectures on various topics. Not only our staff and students, but the people from Mandrup and neighbouring villages benefited from these lectures.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

We have not encountered any problem so far despite having scanty resources. However, the parents of female students are reluctant to allow their ward to participate in sports and cultural activities for they have to travel for this.

Motivation for the Research

2. Goal

The aim of this practice is to sustain and enhance the research culture on the campus, which ultimately will prove very instrumental in enhancing the quality of education imparted by the institution. We do believe that research as important as teaching.

3. The Context

Our college is situated in rural area. Most of our students come from economically, educationally backward and socially marginalized rural families. We are trying our best to give them quality education so that they could compete with any students anywhere. We are well aware of what a great role research can play in this endeavour of ours.

4. The Practice

The management encourages the staff and the students alike to undertake research. Teachers are given D. L. to attend and present research papers in various conferences.

5. Evidence of Success

The college has been approved to be the research centre for Ph. D. in the subjects of Economics and Geography by the university. Ten students are pursuing Ph. D. in the centre. During the academic year 2016-17, two of our faculty members obtained Ph. D. degree. Six other are pursuing this degree. During the academic year 10, 12 and 1 faculty members presented research papers in international, national and state level conferences respectively, while 10, 14 and 10 teachers attended national, state and university level conferences respectively, and 1 teacher was a resource person in a national level seminar, while another teacher was a resource person at a state level conference. Apart from it, 7 and 2 research papers by our faculty have been published

in international peer-reviewed and non-peer reviewed journals respectively. 12 and 10 research papers by our faculty have been published in international and national level conference proceedings respectively. One of the faculty members was a chairperson for three Ph. D. viva voce. One of our faculty members has published 1 book with ISBN and two chapters in edited books. Another faculty has published 6 books without ISBN.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Due to semester pattern, teachers and students get less time to devote to research. Co-curricular and extra-curricular activities also demand their time. These are some of the challenges.
