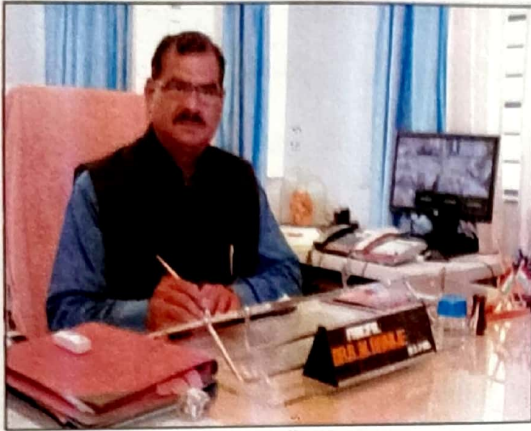

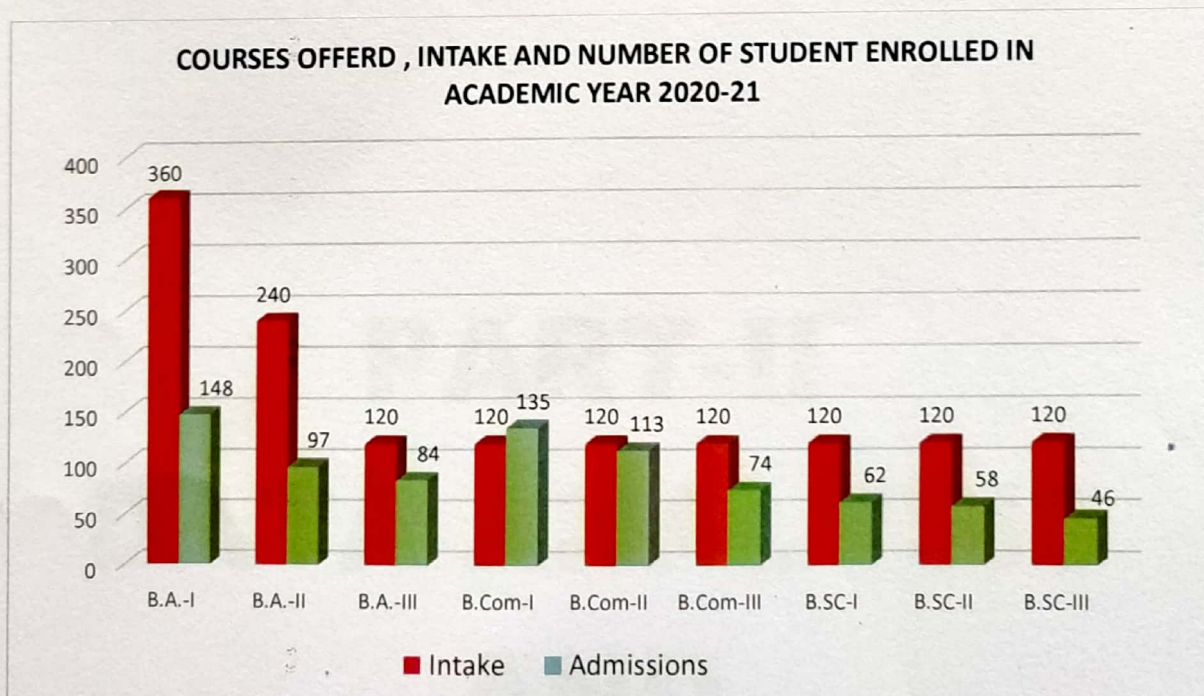

- ✓ Websites of Institute

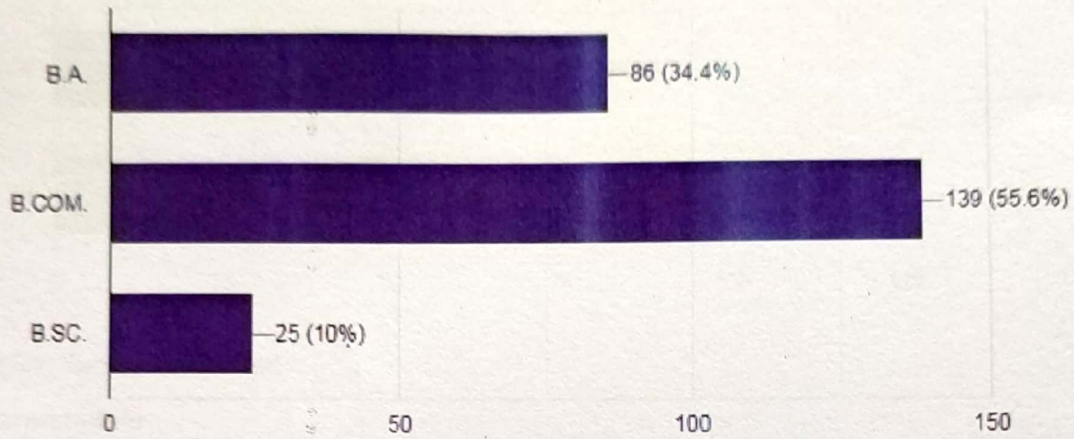
- **Method of Analysis**

Graph No 01) Graph showing course in which respondents (Students) appearing

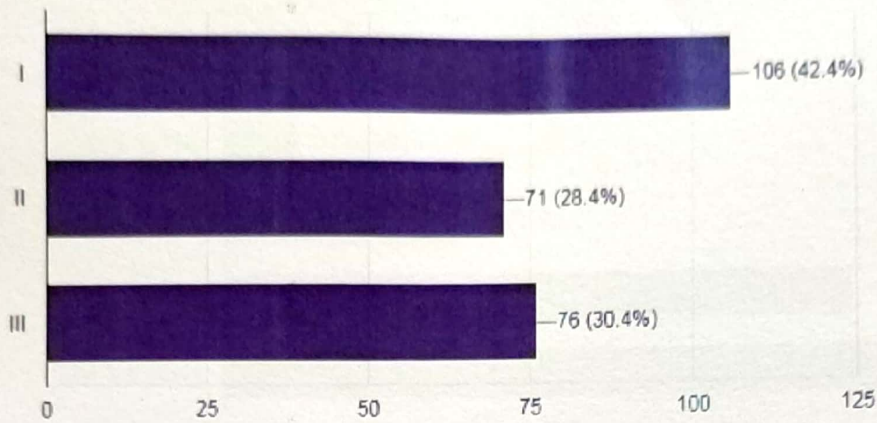

Graph No 02) Graph showing appearing year of the respondents

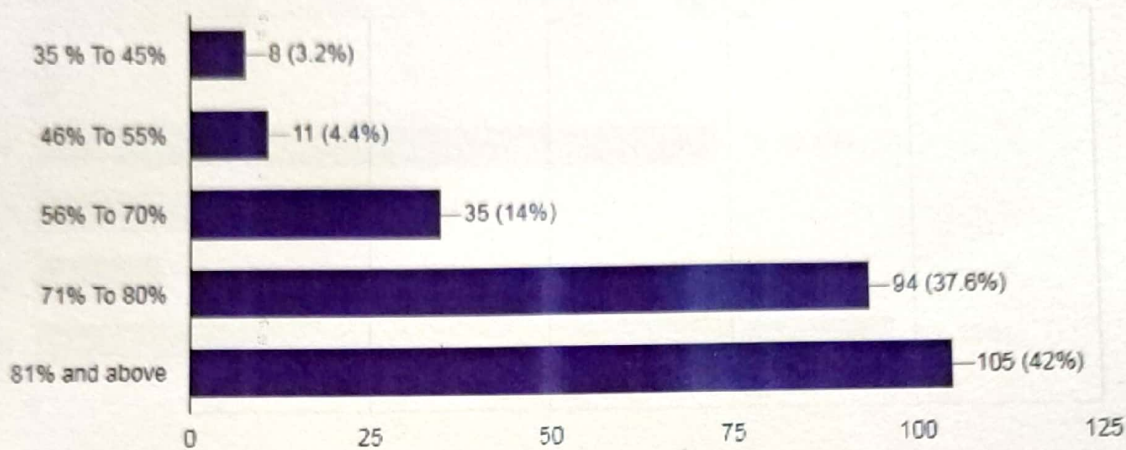

Graph No 03) Graph showing Marks obtained by respondents in Last Examination held

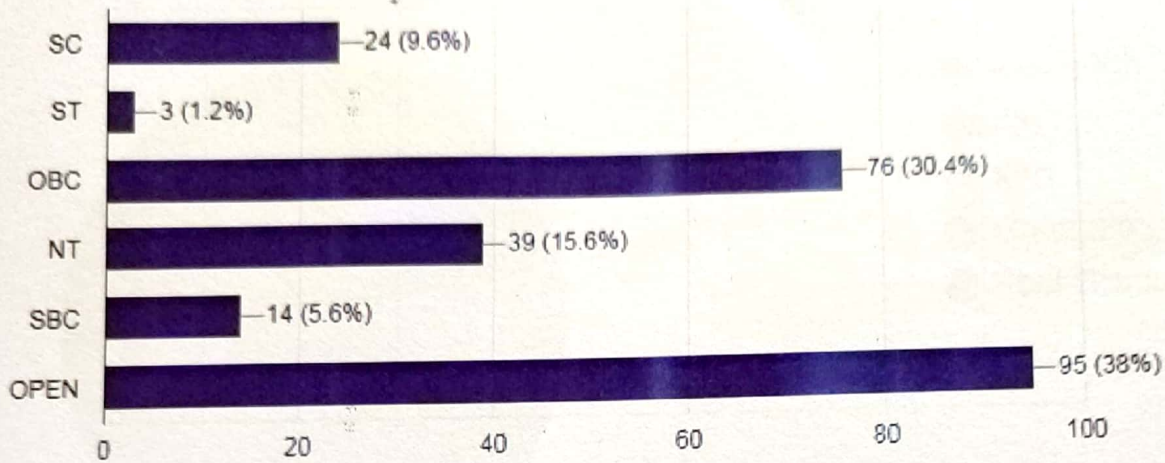

Graph No 04) Graph showing Category of the respondents

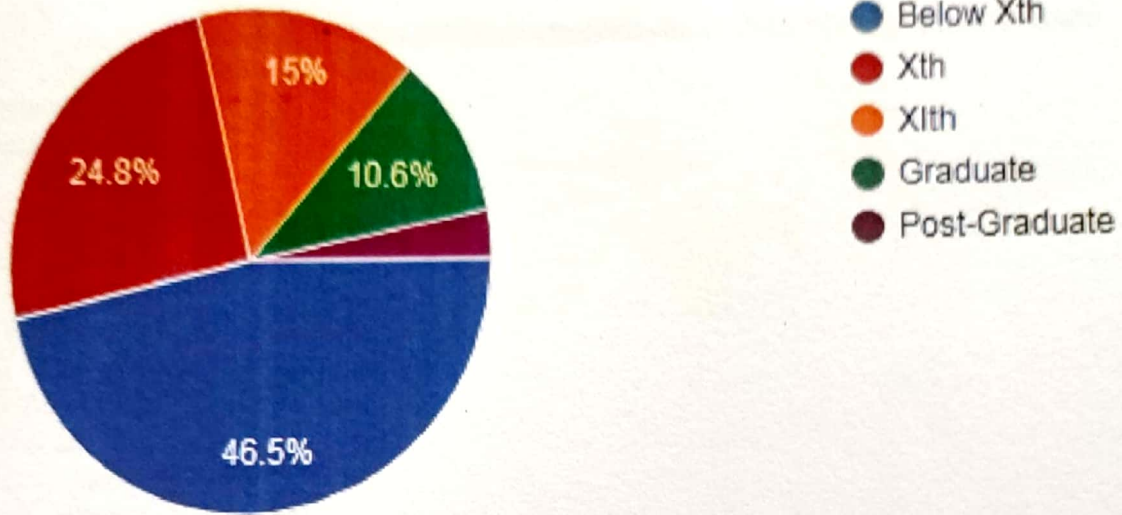

Graph No 05) Graph showing Qualification of Parents

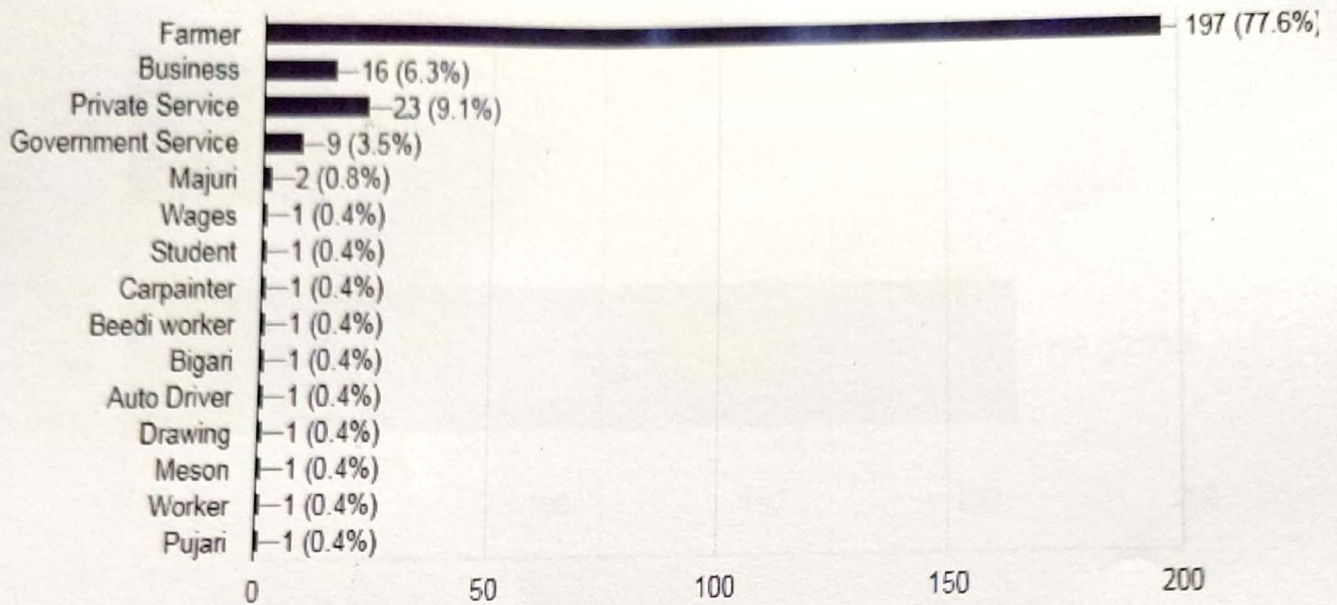

Graph No 06) Graph showing Occupation of Parents

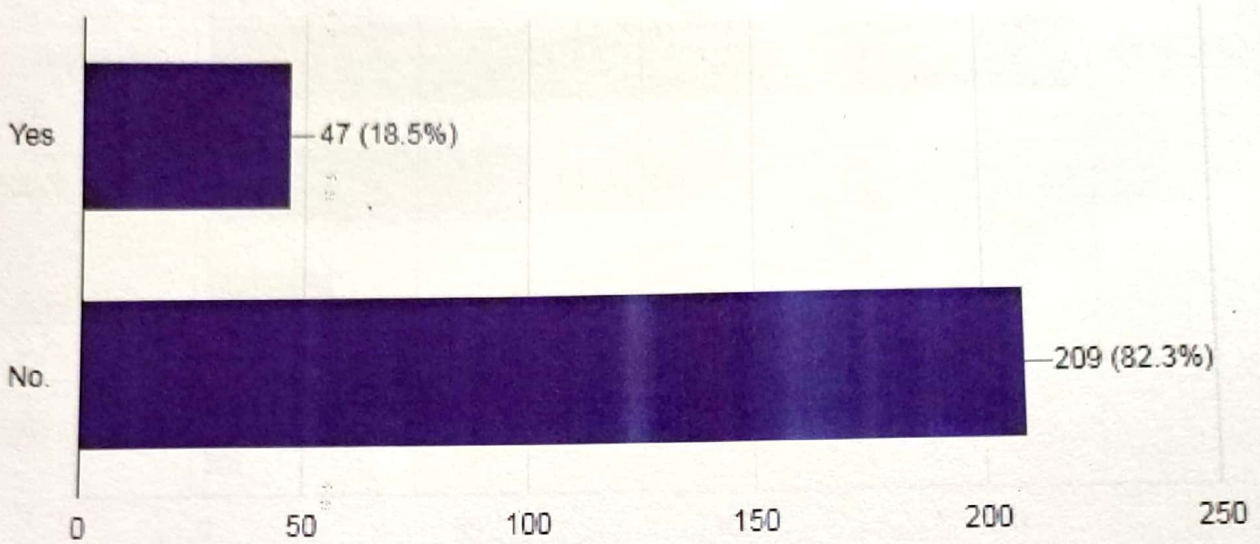

Graph No 07) Graph showing Employment Status of respondents

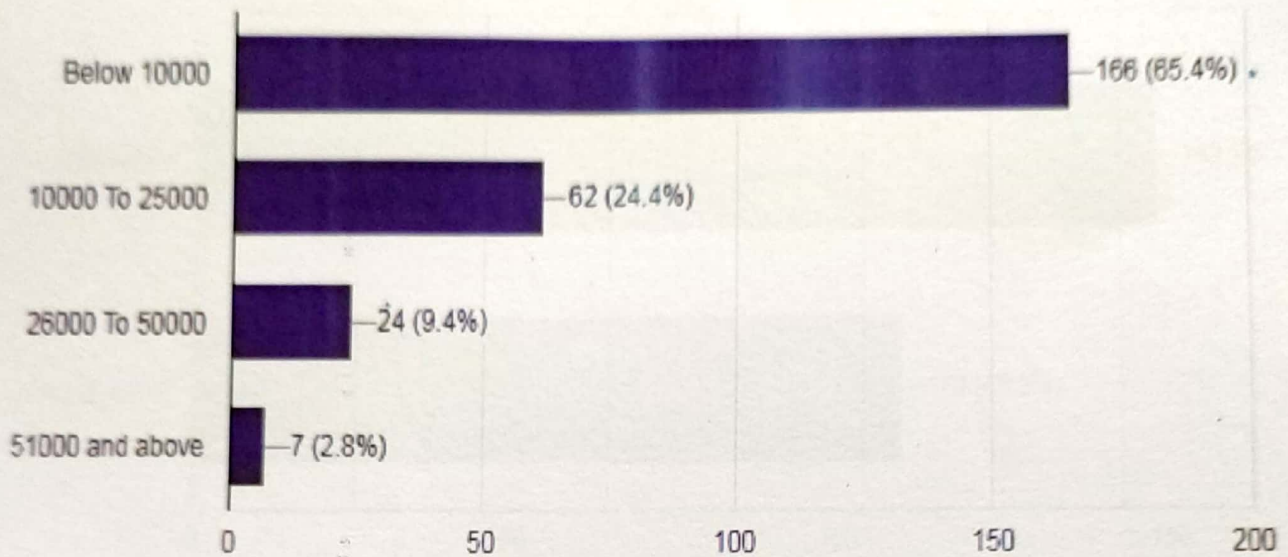

Graph No 08) Graph showing Monthly Income of Family

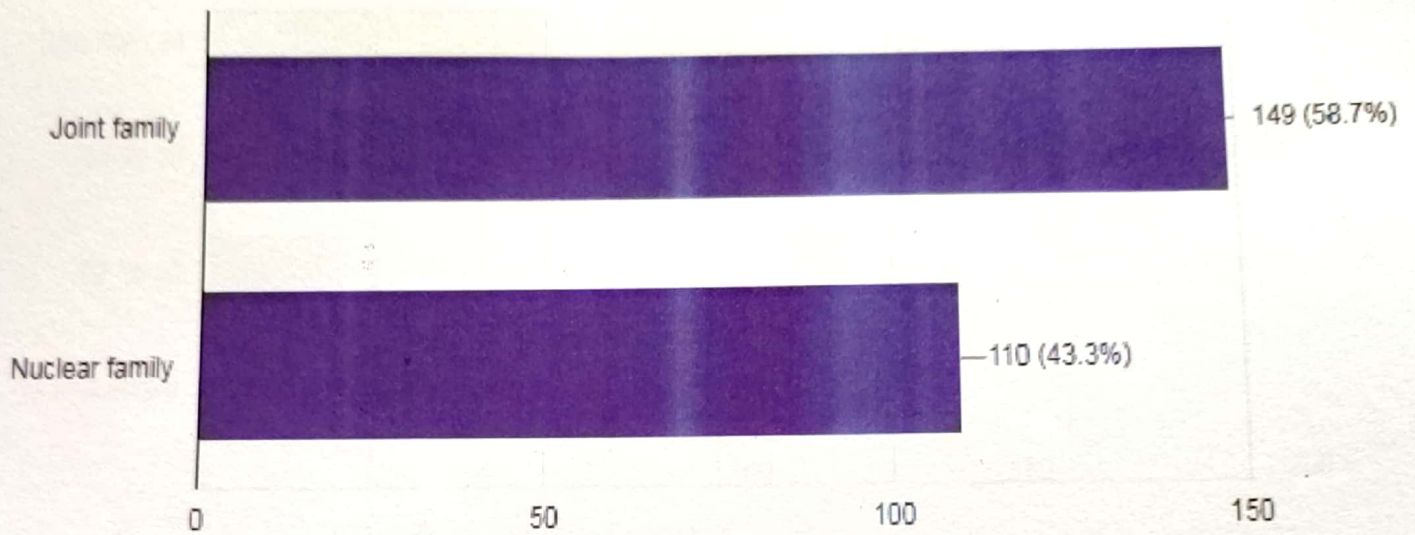

Graph No 09) Graph showing Type of Family

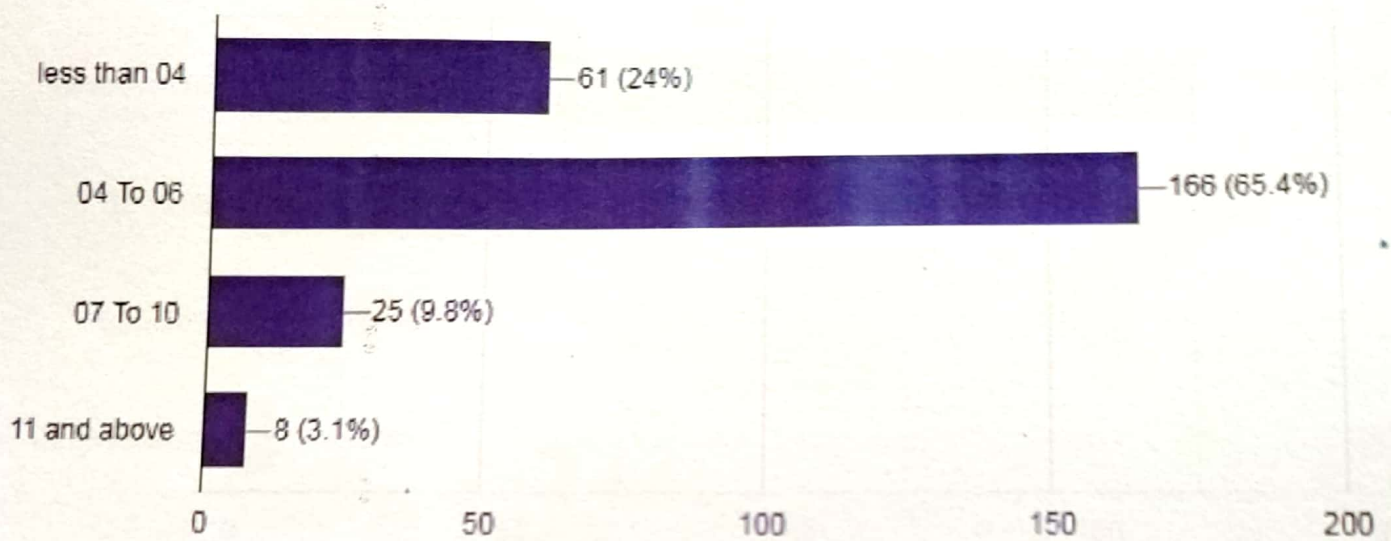

Graph No 10) Graph showing Total no. of family Members

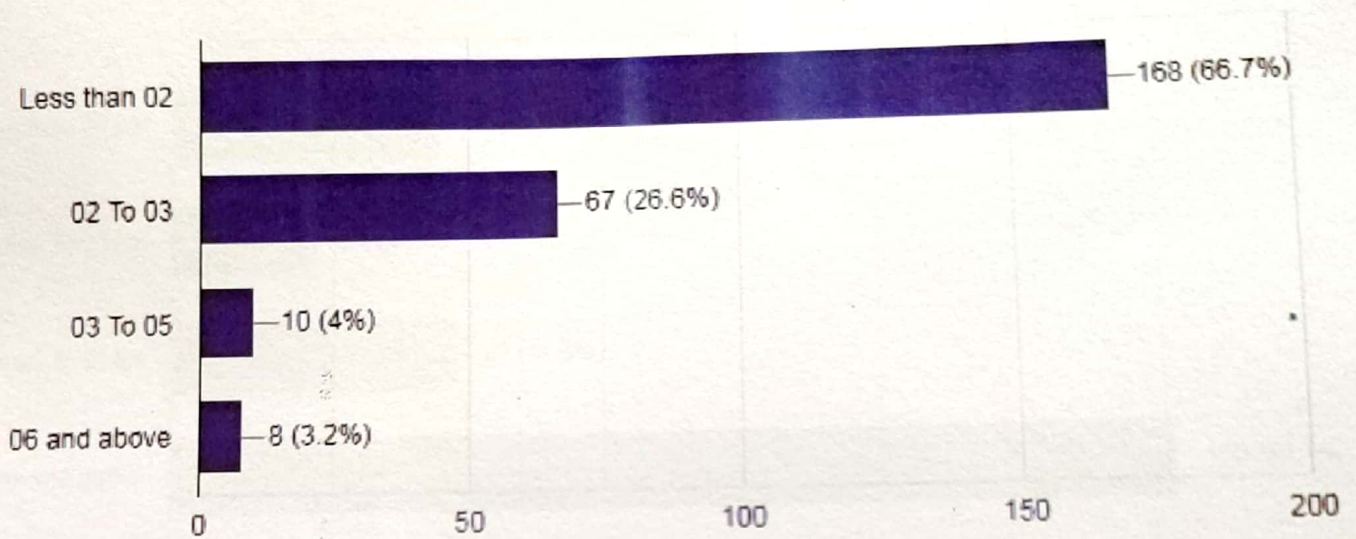

Graph No 11) Graph showing Total no. working members in Family

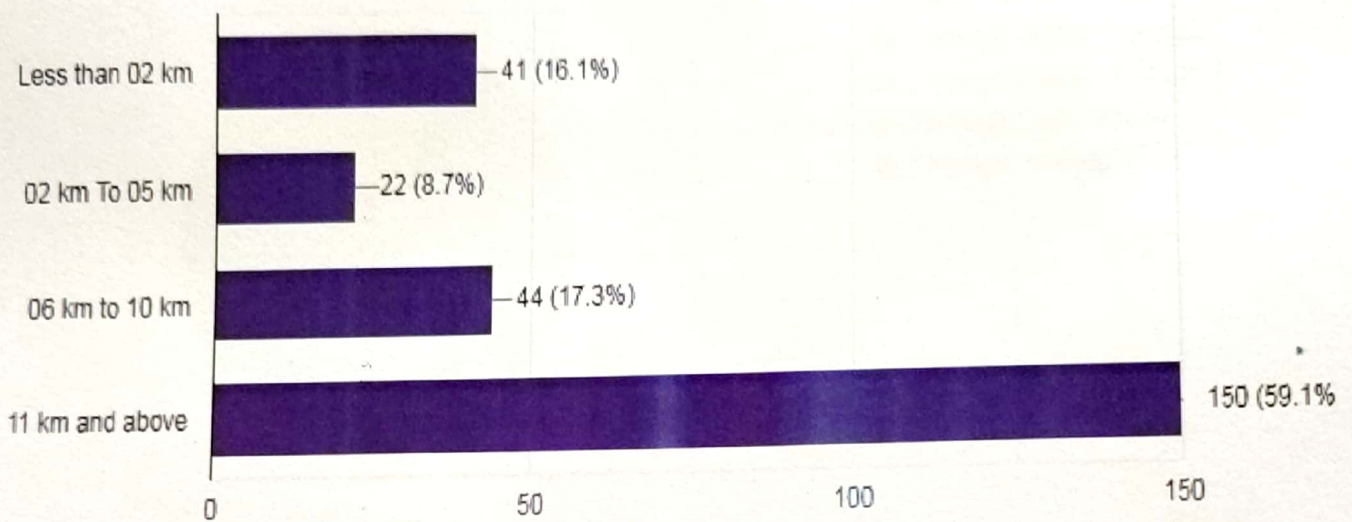

Graph No 12) Graph showing Distance of college from respondents Residence

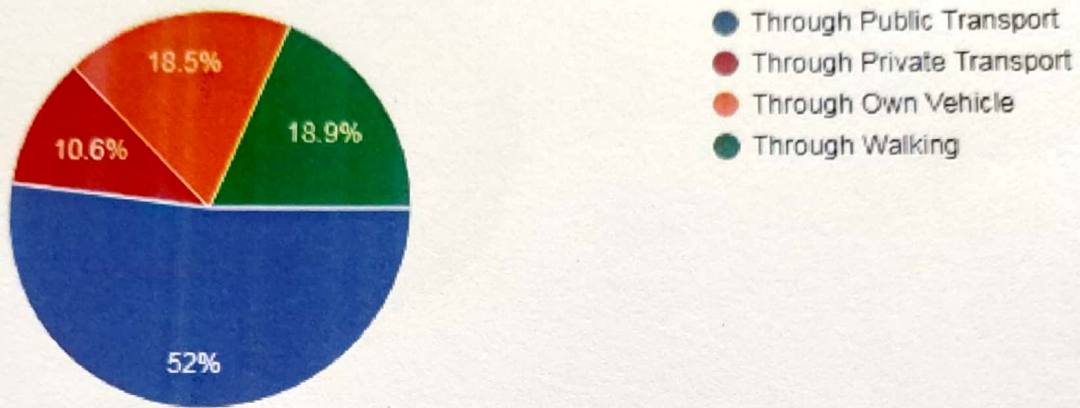

Graph No 13) Graph showing transportation facility used by respondents to reach college

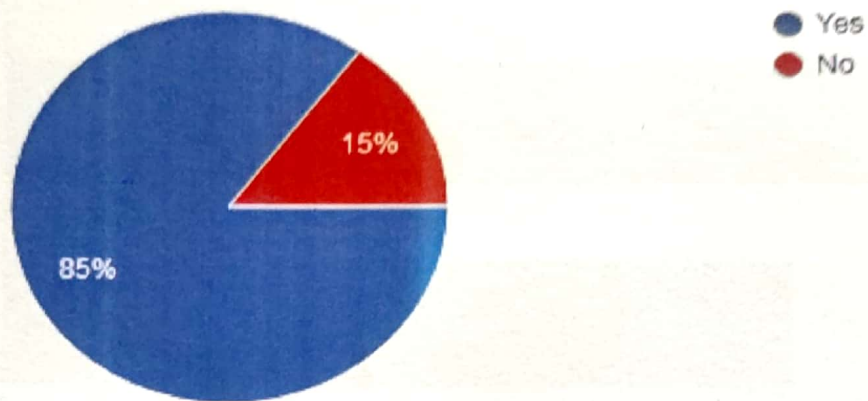

Graph No 14) Graph showing status of house of respondents

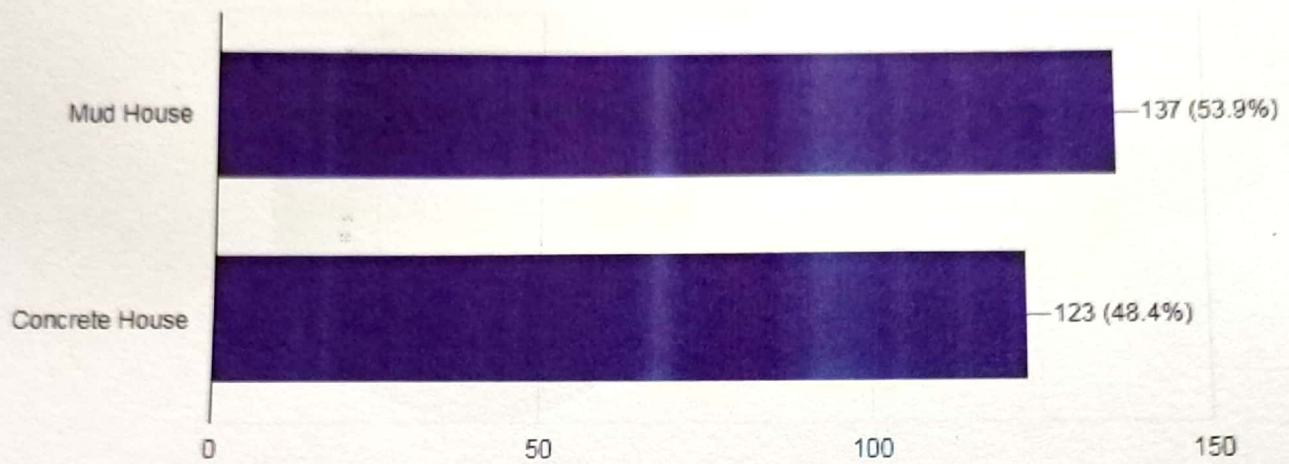

Graph No 15) Graph showing Type of house of respondents

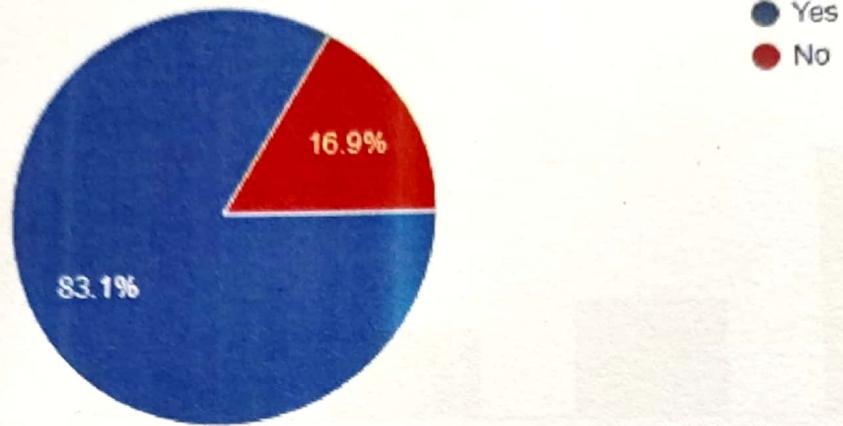

Graph No 16) Graph showing Status of toilet in house

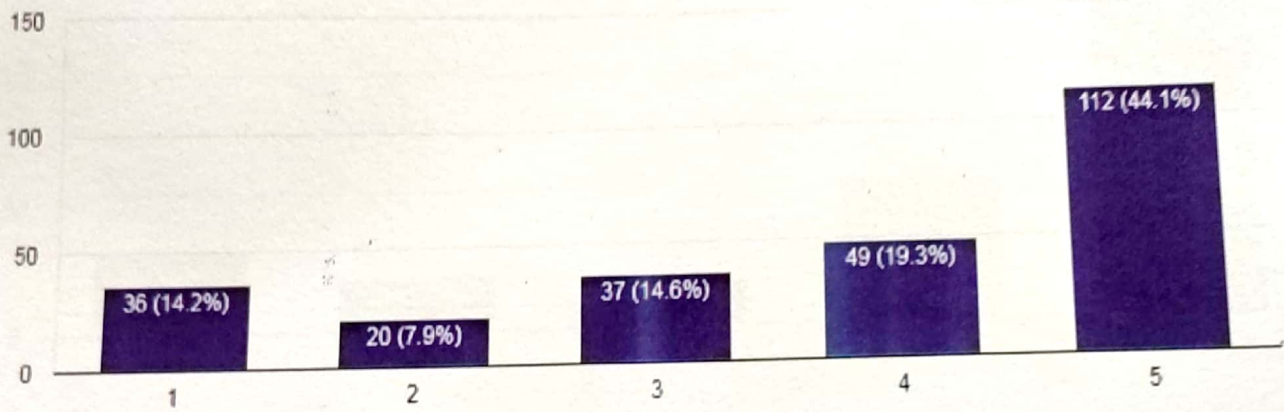

Graph No 17) Graph showing opinion of respondents about overall Infrastructure of college



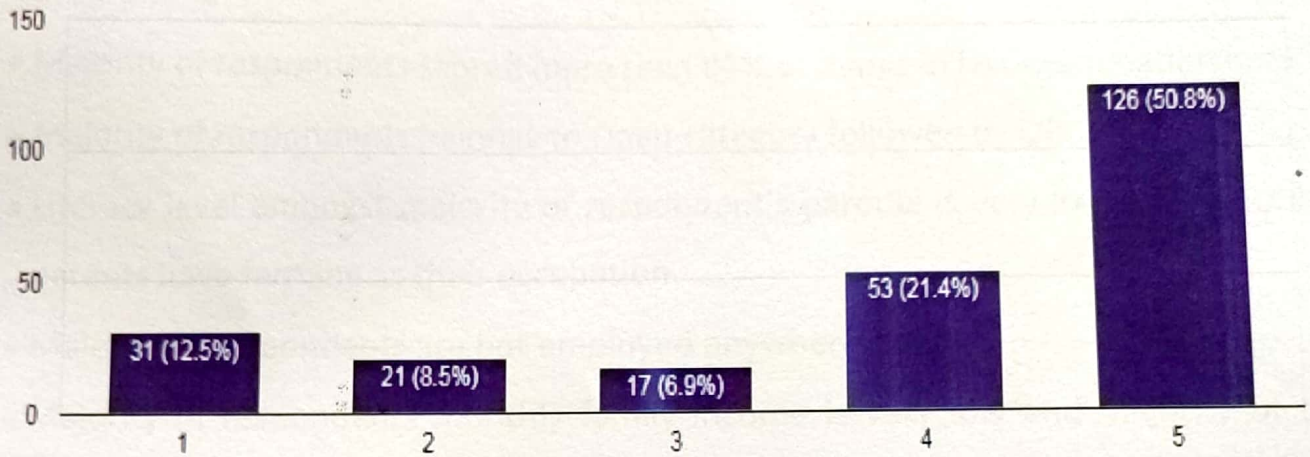

- Majority of respondents have 04 to 06 members in their family and only one member amongst them is working
- Majority of respondents are coming from more than 11km to college and majority of them are using Public Transport.
- Majority of respondents have their own house but majority of respondents house made-up of Mud but Majority of them have toilet at their house
- Majority of respondents are satisfied with Overall Infrastructure, Teaching and Learning facilities of college.

❖ CONCLUSION

Survey was conducted to Study Socio Economic conditions of students in Santosh Bhimrao Patil Arts Commerce & Science College, Mandrup. College is presently functioning in rural part of Solapur and most of the students admitted in college are coming from rural background. Considering this fact and on the basis of survey following conclusion was drawn

Literacy level amongst majority of respondent's parents is very low and majority of parents have farming as their occupation. Majority of respondents monthly family income is very low.
